SECTION 3 - Bylaw Changes

Review the following proposals and place an "x" if you are in favor or oppose the proposal.

Proposal One

Increase the board size from 5 members to 7 members with each member serving a two year overlapping term starting in 2026. The 2026 election would have 7 open positions. 4 members would have 2 year terms. 3 members would have 1 year term. Going forward, even number years would have 4 open positions and odd number years would have 3 open positions. This would create an overlap and avoid having new board members every year.
